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**BID SPECIFICATIONS FOR PROVISION OF TRANSFER STATIONS AND SELF HELP CENTER OPERATION WITH ASSOCIATED HAULING AND DISPOSAL SERVICES FOR THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE.**

- I. Revisions to the Bid Specifications by this Addendum.

**Insert at end of Section 1.4.3, Description of Alternates**

For Alternates A-11 and A-12, approximately 8-10 acres are available on-site for the storage and handling of Yard Waste and Logs. See attached site map of Wauwatosa DPW yard.

**Alternate A-11 – Yard Waste at City of Wauwatosa DPW Yard:**

Process, haul and compost 9,000 tons per year of Yard Waste from the City of Wauwatosa's Department of Public Works Drop-off Center and yard, located at 11100 W Walnut Road. Yard Waste is defined in the Bid Specifications. Timely shredding and/or removal of these materials is required to prevent excess accumulation and interference with site operations. The Contractor shall furnish all vehicles, equipment, and labor. Payment shall be based on Contractor load weights obtained using the City of Wauwatosa truck scale, with hours of operation Monday through Friday, 7 AM to 4:30 PM. Provide a unit cost on a per ton basis.

**Alternate A-12 – Logs at City of Wauwatosa DPW Yard:**

Process, haul and recycle/reuse 1,000 tons per year of Logs from the City of Wauwatosa's Department of Public Works Drop-off Center and yard, located at 11100 W Walnut Road. Logs are defined in the Bid Specifications. Timely shredding and/or removal of logs is required to prevent excess accumulation and interference with site operations. The Contractor shall furnish all vehicles, equipment, and labor. Payment shall be based on Contractor load weights obtained using the City of Wauwatosa truck scale, with hours of operation Monday through Friday, 7 AM to 4:30 PM. Provide a unit cost on a per ton basis.

III. Revision to text

Section 2.3.3, Rejection of Unacceptable Waste (page 2-4), insert the following at the end of the existing text on page 2-5:

If a third party, or any person on behalf of the third party, delivers Unacceptable Waste to the Transfer Station(s) and Self-Help Center(s), the third party shall be notified within 2 hours of such delivery. The Unacceptable Waste will be promptly reloaded by the Contractor, re-weighed, and the cost deducted from the third party's monthly invoice, and removed by the third party or its designees; or the third party, at its option, may direct the Contractor to dispose of such Unacceptable Waste in compliance with all Federal, State, and local statutes, codes, and regulations. Any and all costs incurred by the Contractor with respect to the proper removal and disposal of Unacceptable Waste shall be paid by the third party and reflected as an adjustment to the monthly invoice.

Handling and disposal of the Unacceptable Waste can be performed by the Contractor or Contractor's designee.

IV. **(Previously submitted question #5 from Waste Management – not answered in 1<sup>st</sup> addendum)**

**Question:**

**Unacceptable Waste** – Please expand the definition of “Unacceptable Waste” to include recyclables such as major appliances, tires, and electronics banned from disposal under Wisconsin law (p. 1-7). The Contractor must accept waste from third parties as directed by the City (1.3.1 on p. 8-1), but isn't clearly authorized to reject and chargeback for handling unacceptable waste delivered by those third parties (2.3.3 on p. 2-4). The Contractor's employees may not be qualified to reload hazardous wastes as specified; please allow reloading by the Contractor's designee.

**Response:**

Unacceptable Wastes are defined on page 1-7. Recyclables are defined on page 1-6 and includes materials banned from disposal under Wisconsin law. Solid Waste is defined on page 1-7 and excludes recyclables and Unacceptable Waste. No changes are made to these definitions.

**Section 2.3.3 addresses this issue.**

V. Any revisions to any of the contract documents made by this Addendum shall be considered as the same revision to any and all related areas of the contract documents not specifically called out in this Addendum.
