SCOPE OF WORK

Slurry Seal

Sealcoat bituminous pavements, using a slurry seal consisting of a mixture of emulsified asphalt, mineral aggregate and water, properly proportioned, mixed and spread evenly on the surface as specified and directed. The pavements to be sealcoated are set forth in the attached list. The area to be covered with a slurry seal shall be approximately 195,146 square yards.

The City's work prior to and following the Contractor's sealcoating operations will include sweeping the pavement surfaces to be sealed with mechanical sweepers, patching all holes and surface defects prior to this contract.

The posting of "No Parking Signs" and the closing of the road in accordance with "Work Zone Safety" Guidelines for Construction, Maintenance and Utility Operations Manual dated March 2013 will be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall also be responsible for notifying property owners, residents and businesses affected by their Sealcoating Operation. The cost for posting of traffic control signs, traffic control and posting of notices to residents **shall be included** in the bid for Square Yards of Pavement Slurry Treatment Sealcoating. A copy of the notice to residents shall be submitted to and approved by DPW prior to distribution to the property owners.

The City reserves the right to adjust the sealcoating yardage of the contract. The adjusted yardage shall not exceed 20% of the bid quantity.

Bituminous Chip Seal with Copper Slag Aggregate

Chip Seal bituminous pavements, using a bituminous Chip Seal with Class A, B, or C aggregate consisting of a mixture of bituminous seal coating with stone cover aggregate spread evenly on the surface as specified and directed. The pavements to be chip sealed are set forth in the attached list. The area to be covered with a chip seal shall be approximately 23,200 square yards.

The City's work prior to and following the Contractor's chip seal operations will include sweeping the pavement surfaces to be sealed with mechanical sweepers, patching all holes and surface defects prior to this contract.

The posting of "No Parking Signs" and the closing of the road in accordance with "Work Zone Safety" Guidelines for Construction, Maintenance and Utility Operations Manual dated March 2013 will be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall also be responsible for notifying property owners, residents and businesses affected by their Chip Seal Operation. The cost for posting of traffic control signs, traffic control and posting of notices to residents **shall be included** in the bid for Square Yards of Chip Seal Pavement Treatment. A copy of the notice to residents shall be submitted to and approved by DPW prior to distribution to the property owners.

The City reserves the right to adjust the chip seal yardage of the contract. The adjusted yardage shall not exceed 20% of the bid quantity.

Fog Seal

Chip sealed bituminous pavements **shall/should** be Fog Sealed as the last step of chip sealing the pavement. This work consists of furnishing all materials, equipment, labor and preparation necessary for an application of a fog seal following a chip seal. A fog seal is a light application of a slow setting emulsion diluted with water. The pavements to be Fog Sealed are set forth in the attached list for chip seal. The area to be covered with a Fog Seal shall be approximately 23,200 square yards..

The posting of "No Parking Signs" and the closing of the road in accordance with "Work Zone Safety" Guidelines for Construction, Maintenance and Utility Operations Manual dated March 2013 will be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall also be responsible for notifying property owners, residents and businesses affected by their Fog Seal Operation. The cost for posting of traffic control signs, traffic control and posting of notices to residents **shall be included** in the bid for Square Yards of Fog Seal.

The City reserves the right to adjust the Fog Seal yardage of the contract. The adjusted yardage shall not exceed 20% of the bid quantity.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. Work shall be performed in accordance with the City of Milwaukee, Infrastructure Services Division, Street Construction Specifications dated July 1, 1992 and with the 2013 State of Wisconsin DOT "Standard Specifications for Highway and Structure Construction".
2. It is the City's intent to have all the streets included in this contract patched and crackfilled prior to the Contractor commencing operations.
3. The City reserves the right to adjust the bid quantities on this contract contingent on the availability of funds. The adjusted quantities shall not exceed 20% of the bid quantities
4. The slurry seal program of approximately 195,146 square yards of bituminous pavement shall be divided into daily production routes of approximately 18,000 square yards for the slurry seal operation. The Contractor will provide the daily routes for sealcoating to the City of Milwaukee Sealing Supervisor. Changes in route schedules must be made 48 hours in advance unless approved by the Sealing Supervisor.

The cured slurry seal treatment shall have a homogeneous appearance and be in conformance with the following requirements:

Asphalt Emulsion: The emulsified asphalt shall conform to the requirements of AASHTO Designation: M208, Cationic Emulsified Asphalt. The type used in making the slurry mixture shall be CSS-1 or CSS-1H.

Aggregates: The aggregates shall consist of wet bottom boiler slag, blended with natural or manufactured sand, crushed gravel, crushed stone or other hard durable miner aggregates and mineral filler, if required, to provide a mixture complying with the following requirements:

Furnish aggregates in accordance with Section 455 except as modified hereafter.

Wet bottom boiler slag shall constitute 40 to 65 percent by weight of the aggregate mixture.

Mineral filler, meeting the requirements of AASHTO M-85, Type I Portland Cement shall be blended as needed in the mix to improve the gradation of aggregate, improve the workability of the mix, or adjust the setting time of the emulsion.

Aggregate components other than the wet bottom boiler slag and the mineral filler shall conform to the following requirements:

When tested in accordance with AASHTO T104 (fine aggregate procedure using sodium sulfate), the soundness loss shall not be more than 15 percent, by weight, in five cycles.

When tested in accordance with AASHTO T96, Grading D, the abrasion loss shall be not more than 40 percent.

Aggregates shall be free of vegetative matter and other deleterious materials.

All water used with the slurry seal mixture shall be potable and free from harmful soluble salts.

The Contractor shall provide suitable storage facilities for the asphalt emulsion. The container shall be equipped to prevent water from entering the emulsion. Suitable heat shall be provide, as necessary, to prevent freezing.

The final aggregate blend, including mineral filler, shall comply with the following gradation requirements:

The amount of asphalt emulsion to be blended with the aggregate is expected to be in the range of 15 to 20 percent by weight of dry aggregate, but the actual amount to be used shall be determined and agreed upon by the Contractor and the Sealing Supervisor, on the basis of laboratory tests, with final adjustments in the field. A minimum amount of water shall be added as necessary to obtain a fluid homogeneous mixture.

The rate of application of aggregate shall be a minimum of 17 plus or minus 2 pounds per square yard on the surface and to true up the surface and give it a uniform appearance.

Contractor's Required Equipment: All equipment, tools and machines used in the performance of the work on the contract will be subject to the approval of the Sealing Supervisor and shall be maintained in satisfactory working order at all times. The Contractor shall not start work at the beginning of the day unless all equipment is operating in a condition satisfactory to the Sealing Supervisor.

For the slurry seal treatments, the slurry mixing machines shall be continuous flow mixing units capable of delivering accurately a predetermined proportion of aggregate, water and asphalt emulsion to the mixing chamber and to discharge the thoroughly

mixed product on a continuous basis. The aggregate shall be pre-wetted immediately prior to mixing with the emulsion. The mixing unit of the mixing chamber shall be capable of thoroughly blending all ingredients together. No violent mixing will be permitted.

The slurry seal mixing machine shall be equipped with an approved fines feeder that provides an accurate metering device or method to introduce a predetermined proportion of mineral filler into the mixer at the same time and location that the aggregate is fed. The fines feeder shall be used whenever added mineral filler is a part of the aggregate blend.

Attached to the slurry seal mixing machine shall be a mechanical type squeegee distributor equipped with flexible material in contact with the surface to prevent loss of slurry from the distributor. It shall be maintained so as to prevent loss of slurry on varying grades and crown by adjustments to assure uniform spread. There shall be a steering device and a flexible strike-off. The spreader box shall have an adjustable width so as to match the width of the bituminous surface on which the slurry is to be applied. The box shall be kept clean and buildup of asphalt and aggregate on the box will not be permitted. The use of burlap drags or other drags shall be approved by the Sealing Supervisor.

There shall be an adequate amount of slurry seal mixing units and slurry spreading units available at all times during the sealing operations, so as not to halt or delay the day's operation.

The Contractor shall furnish power broom, power blowers, air compressors, water flushing equipment, hand brooms, hand squeegees, shovels and any other equipment as necessary to perform the work.

Application of Slurry Seal – The surface shall be pre-wetted by fogging ahead of the slurry box if required by local conditions. Water used in pre-wetting the surface shall be applied at such a rate that the entire surface is damp with no apparent flowing water in front of the slurry box. The slurry mixture shall be of the desired consistency when deposited on the surface and no additional elements shall be added. Total time of mixing shall not exceed one minute. A sufficient amount of slurry shall be carried in all parts of the spreader at all times so that complete coverage is obtained. No lumping, balling, or unmixed aggregate will be permitted. No segregation of the emulsion and aggregate will be permitted. If the course aggregate settles to the bottom of the mix, the slurry seal shall be removed from the pavement. No excessive breaking of the emulsion will be allowed in the spreader box. No streaks, such as caused by oversized aggregates shall be left in the finished pavement.

No excessive buildup or unsightly appearance will be permitted on longitudinal or transverse joints. Approved squeegees shall be used to spread slurry in non-accessible areas to the slurry mixer. Care shall be exercised in leaving no unsightly appearance from hand work.

Treated areas will be allowed to cure until such time that the Contractor and the Sealing Supervisor agree to permit their opening to traffic.

5. **Description:** The work shall consist of bituminous seal coating with stone cover aggregate. The work shall be done in accordance with Section 4.75 of the 2013 State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation “Standard Specifications for Highway and Structure Construction” with the Special provisions for aggregate below.

Materials: Provide a Class A, B, or C aggregate. Use aggregates, uniform in quality and free from wood, bark, roots and other deleterious materials. All Class C aggregates shall be 80% crushed one face (mechanical or natural), of the plus 4.75 mm [#4] fraction. Gradation and quality requirements are specified in the item “B” below. All percentages are by weight.

- A. **Bituminous Material:** The bituminous material to be furnished and applied shall be CRS-2P (Polymer-modified) emulsion. The emulsion shall be applied at a rate of 0.33 +/- .02 gallons per square yard. The bitumen shall be applied at the appropriate temperature for the particular grade.
- B. **Cover Aggregate:** The cover aggregate (FA-2½) shall meet the requirements of the sieve specifications, and conform to the following sieve size.

Class A aggregate shall consist of crushed quarry or mine trap rock (basalt, diabase, gabbro or other related igneous rock types), quartzite, gneiss or granite. Other igneous or metamorphic quarry or mine rock may be used only with approval of the Engineer. Crushed aggregate produced from igneous or quartzite stones retained on a 100 mm (4 inch) screen will also be permitted by approval of the Engineer.

Class B aggregate shall consist of all other crushed quarry or mine rock; i.e., carbonates, rhyolite, schist.

Class C aggregate shall consist of natural or partly crushed natural gravel obtained from a natural gravel deposit. It may contain a quantity of material obtained from crushing the oversize stone in a deposit, provided such crushed material is uniformly mixed with natural, uncrushed particles.

The aggregate shall be applied at the rate of 20 +/- 2 pounds per square yard. The Contractor shall take all precautions to minimize contamination of the aggregate.

Equipment: The Contractor shall have available and maintain in good working order the equipment and tools necessary to perform the work. The requirements for the equipment for heating the asphaltic material and for the distributors shall be as set forth in Section 402. The equipment to be used shall include dragging equipment and aggregate spreading equipment that can be adjusted to spread accurately the quantities specified per square yard, and a minimum of two self-propelled, pneumatic-tire rollers meeting the requirements of Subsection 408.4.5.

Construction Methods: Surface Preparations: Immediately prior to applying the asphaltic materials, the Contractor shall thoroughly clean the existing surface of all loose material, silt spots, vegetation, and other objectionable material. Dust and other loose material in depressions or other places not reached by mechanical sweepers shall be swept with hand brooms or by blowers or flushers. Particular care shall be taken to thoroughly clean the outer edges of the area to be sealed. All costs associated with preparing existing surfaces as described above shall be included in the bid price for Pavement Chip Seal.

Applying Asphaltic Materials: A pressure distributor shall be used for applying the asphalt material. It shall have a ground speed control device interconnected with the asphalt emulsion pump such that specified application rate will be supplied at any speed. The pressure distributor shall be capable of maintaining the asphalt emulsion at the specified temperature. The spray bar nozzles shall produce a uniform fan spray, and the shutoff shall be instantaneous, with no dripping. Each pressure distributor shall be capable of maintaining the specified application rate. Means shall be provided for accurately indicating the temperature of the asphalt material at all times. The thermometer well shall not be in contact with a heating tube. Application will be with full width equipment capable of applying 24' without a center seam. A hose and spray nozzle attachment shall be provided for applying asphalt material to patches and areas inaccessible to the spray bar. The distributor shall be provided with heaters that can be used to bring the asphalt material to spray application temperature.

Applying Sealcoat Aggregate: After application of the asphaltic material and when the desired stage of tackiness is attained, aggregate for seal coat cover shall be spread uniformly over the treated surface by approved self-propelled mechanical full width spreader capable of applying aggregate 24' without a seam.

Rolling of Aggregate: Roll surface immediately after spreading the aggregate. Rolling shall start at the edges and continue to the center, lapping one-half the roller width on each successive trip. Rolling shall be accomplished with two pneumatic-tire rollers. The speed and reversing of direction of rollers shall be regulated as to avoid displacement or loosening of the cover material or damage to the asphaltic material. Rolling shall be continued until the aggregate for the seal coat cover is thoroughly embedded and the surface is smooth and uniform in texture.

6. Fog Seal: This work consists of furnishing all materials, equipment, labor and preparation necessary for an application of a fog seal following a chip seal. A fog seal is a light application of a slow-setting emulsion diluted with water. All work and materials

shall be in accordance with the Standard Specifications for Construction, except as modified herein.

Materials: The materials shall meet the following requirement –
Asphalt Emulsion: CSS-1h

Equipment: Equipment shall be safe, environmentally acceptable, and capable of producing a quality product.

Pressure Distributer: The pressure distributor shall have a ground speed control device interconnected with the asphalt emulsion pump such that the specified application rate will be supplied at any speed. The pressure distributor shall be capable of maintaining the asphalt emulsion at the specified temperature. The spray bar nozzles shall produce a uniform fan spray, and the shutoff shall be instantaneous, with no dripping. Each pressure distributor shall be capable of maintaining the specified application rate within +/- 0.015 gal/sq. yd. for each load.

Miscellaneous: A power broom and all necessary hand tools, thermometers, etc., shall be provided. Distributors and power brooms shall be equipped with at least one visible approved flashing, rotating, or oscillating amber light.

Weather Limitations: The fog seal shall be placed when the pavement and atmospheric temperature is 55°F or above. Placement is not permitted if there is threatening weather and temperatures are forecasted to be below 32°F within 24 hours from the time of work.

Construction: The Engineer shall require the longitudinal construction joint to be either placed at the edge of metal of the driving lane, at a location requiring 1 foot overlap on the center driving lane.

The Contractor shall complete the application of the fog seal within 48 hours of the application of chip seal, but shall not apply the fog seal on the same day as the application of chip seal.

Asphalt Emulsion: Emulsion applied by a pressure distributor shall be applied at a uniform rate, without splattering or drilling from the spray bar by using low pressure. Nozzle angle and spray bar height must be adjusted to insure correct spray pattern.

The asphalt emulsion shall be diluted in proportions of one part emulsion to one part water (50% / 50%) The dilution shall be done at the emulsion plant.

The recommended total quantity of fog seal used shall be within the range of 0.10 to 0.15 gal/syd of diluted material. The objective for a proper application of fog seal is to apply a uniform coverage of emulsion, just sufficient to flow into and seal the pavement pores, small cracks, and voids to protect against water infiltration and weathering and to also prevent loss of aggregate from the chip seal.

Quality Control: If there are adverse environmental conditions, the Contractor will provide the Sealing Supervisor an action plan that clearly demonstrates how the fog seal operation will be adjusted for the actual environmental conditions.

7. The Contractor may start work after June 8, 2015. All work must be completed by July 31, 2015. The Contractor shall notify the Commissioner of Public Works a minimum of 10 days in advance of starting work on this contract.
8. The Contractor's hours of work are restricted to 6:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. daily unless approved by the Sealing Supervisor.
9. Work shall proceed in a continuous manner except for periods of inclement weather. The Contractor shall not stop work on this contract without the approval of or direction from the Commissioner of Public Works. The Contractor shall notify the Sealing Supervisor at 286-2136 prior to 7:00 a.m. on any day he is unable to work on the contract. A daily penalty of \$50.00 shall be levied upon the failure to call the Street Sealing Supervisor.
10. Weather – During periods of rain or inclement weather, sealcoating or chip seal material shall not be placed without approval of the Commissioner or his representative. After periods of rain or inclement weather, all pavement surfaces must be free of moisture prior to continuance of applying the sealcoating or chip sealing materials.

Slurry seal and chip seal shall not be applied when either the pavement or air temperature is 55 degrees F or below and falling, but may be applied when both the air and pavement temperature is 45 degrees F or above and rising.
11. Samples of all sealcoating and chip sealing materials used by the Contractor shall be tested two weeks before contract start date at an approved and qualified testing laboratory in accordance with industry standards and the results provided to the City (Mr. Jeff Dellemann at (414) 286-2078). The costs for this testing, including mailing or handling charges are the responsibility of the Contractor and shall be included in the cost for the sealcoating and/or chip sealing.
12. Due to numerous civic events in the City, sealcoating and chip sealing locations may be substituted or removed from daily routes so as not to interfere with any scheduled civic event.
13. Suitable methods, approved by the Sealing Supervisor, shall be used by the Contractor to protect the public and the uncured surfaces from all types of traffic. Any damage to the uncured surfaces will be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor will be responsible for opening of the roadways to traffic and removing their barricades from each location.
14. Quantities of materials used shall be verified by weight slips from a certified scale. All quantities of the asphalt emulsion shall be verified by daily delivery tickets and be subject to the metering device on the distributor.
15. The Contractor shall provide sanitary conveniences for his employees as stated in 208.9 Sanitary Regulations, Street Construction Specifications.
16. All sealed streets on this contract will be reviewed by the Sealing Supervisor during the first spring following the sealing operations to determine if failures may exist to warrant corrections. Corrections for any failures will be discussed with the Sealing Supervisor

and addressed accordingly. Any work deemed the responsibility of the Contractor will be made at the Contractor's expense.

17. All parking and traffic control shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. Traffic control shall conform to the "Work Zone Safety" Guidelines for Construction, Maintenance and Utility Operations dated March 2013. The Contractor will be responsible for posting "No Parking" signs and placing barricades for street closures. The City of Milwaukee will be responsible for patching holes with asphalt and pre-sweeping with power brooms. The Contractor will be responsible for covering manholes, gate valves and sewer inlets with cardboard. All "No Parking" signs, traffic cones and barricades will be picked up by the Contractor at the end of the day or the next morning. The Contractor shall proceed in such manner as to interfere with traffic as little as possible. The Contractor shall provide a flagmen as needed to direct traffic on streets where travel will be restricted.
18. The Contractor will be responsible for removing the cardboard from the protected areas and removing their barricades for street closures when operations are complete and the road is ready for traffic.
19. Forestry Special Provisions: Caution should be used during the construction process to avoid damage to the roots, trunks, and branches of all street trees. Damage caused to any street tree will be repaired by the Forestry Division and the costs of repair, rejuvenation, and/or value lost will be billed to the Contractor or credited against the contract at the option of the City.
20. At locations where the Contractor has not complied with the Forestry Special Requirements stated in the special provisions above, and the maximum clearance was exceeded or a thin form was not used, a minimum credit to the City of \$50.00 per location will be taken. The credit will increase in proportion to the excess distance beyond clearance allowed. The credit will be \$50.00 for each two inch increment or part thereof in excess of the initial clearance allowed. If, in the opinion of the Forestry Division, the tree has been damaged to the point that it warrants removal, the credit that will be taken will be equal to \$100.00 per inch diameter of the tree. A field measurement will be taken to determine the tree size.
21. Partial Payments: Partial payments will be made to the Contractor if the duration of the contract exceeds 30 calendar days. The first partial payment will be made based on estimated quantities completed during the first 30 calendar days of the contract. Additional partial payments, if needed, will be made approximately every 30 calendar days during the duration of the contract.
22. In accordance with Common council File No. 900859 adopted October 16, 1990, the provisions of SS 66.285, Stats., relative to prompt payment are modified as follows: The City of Milwaukee as a matter of policy shall strive to pay all invoices within thirty (30) days. Payment to the Contractor will be deemed timely if the payment is mailed, delivered, or transferred within 60 calendar days after receipt of a properly completed invoice (including all required attachments such as stored material forms, guarantees, manuals, as-built plans, etc.), or receipt and acceptance of the property or service, or the date of final completion as determined by the City when all corrective measures are complete on punch list items under the order or contract, whichever is later. If the City does not make payment by the 60th calendar day, the City shall pay simple interest

beginning with the 31st calendar day at the rate of one percent per month. No interest will be paid on final payments of 10% of the contract, or \$1,000.00, whichever is greater.

 2. All stormwater inlets adjacent to and on the project site shall have type M inlet protection.
 3. If the frame of any stormwater inlet is removed or openings are in the masonry and stormwater may enter, the protection device should be changed to a type R.
 4. Any manholes that the frame is removed or openings are in the masonry and stormwater may enter shall have a type R erosion control.
- Temporary storage piles:
 1. Storage of erodible materials (i.e. gravel) should not be closer than 25 feet from a roadway or drainage way. If placed in the right-of-way, the stockpiles shall not be placed closer than 100 feet of an unprotected storm drain. Covering or surrounding with straw bales, silt fence or other measures, shall control erosion from stockpiles existing less than ten (10) days. Stockpiles existing longer than ten (10) days shall be seeded and mulched.
- Tracking:
 1. The project and surrounding roadways shall be kept free from materials that may enter the drainage system. Tracked roadways shall be cleaned immediately by means other than flushing with water.
 2. Tracking pads at ingress and egress points may be used to help control tracking of sediment onto roadway surfaces. The pads shall be constructed with a minimum of 2-inch size stone, 8-feet wide and a minimum of 50-feet long.
 3. The project roadways should be cleaned on a daily basis. Cleaning shall be done by means other than flushing with water.

- Location of sediment controls (i.e. silt fence, straw bales, waddles and other planned practices) that minimize the amount of sediment from leaving the site:
 1. The “*Wisconsin Construction Site Best Management Practices Handbook*” should be consulted.
- Dewatering:
 1. Water containing particles of 100 microns or greater shall be treated by use of temporary sediment basins or other devices designed to remove particles of 100 microns or greater.
- Vegetation:
 1. The construction activity should be staged as to limit the amount of time vegetation is stripped and re-established.
- Maintenance:
 1. A schedule for maintaining all erosion control devices is necessary to maximize the effort of limiting sediment from entering the drainage system.
 2. All devices should be checked and maintained after a rainfall event that totals 0.50 inches.
 3. All devices should be checked and maintained at least once a week.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Effective immediately, the City of Milwaukee has adopted an ordinance relative to Prompt Payment as follows:

2.9.16.b) It is the City's policy to pay all invoices within 30 days. If the City does not make payment within 45 days after receipt of properly completed supporting payment and other required contract documentation, the City shall pay simple interest beginning with the 31st calendar day at the rate of one percent per month (unless the amount due is subject to a good-faith dispute and, before the 45th day of receipt, notice of the dispute is sent to the contractor by first-class mail, personally delivered, or sent in accordance with the notice provisions in the contract). If there are subcontractors, consistent with s.66.0135(3), Wis. Stats., the prime contractor must pay the subcontractors for satisfactory work within seven days of the contractor's receipt of payment from the City of Milwaukee, or seven days from receipt of a properly submitted and approved invoice from the subcontractor, whichever is later. If the contractor fails to make timely payment to a subcontractor, the contractor shall pay interest at the rate of 12 percent per year, compounded monthly, beginning with the 8th calendar day. Reference Common Council File No. 101137 adopted January 2011.

Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Provisions

I. General

- A. In accordance with Chapter 370 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation is required in all contracting activities of the Department of Public Works. The ordinance requires that certified SBEs be utilized for 25% of the total dollars annually expended through prime contracts or subcontracts for Construction and the purchase of Goods and Services. For the purchase of Professional Services the requirement is 18%. To that end, the Commissioner of Public Works, as a contracting officer for the City, requires all bidders to utilize SBEs as subcontractors and material suppliers on all contracts. For this contract, bidders are required to achieve the minimum percent of SBE participation listed in the Acknowledgements page/section and/or the Official Notice document.
- B. The prime contractor shall prepare and submit accurate and timely SBE utilization forms and reports to the Department of Public Works. The reports shall include, but not be limited to, Compliance Plan (Form A), monthly utilization (Form D), and SBE subcontractor payment certification (Form E) forms as directed. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until final SBE utilization reports and SBE subcontractor payment certification forms are on file with the Department of Public Works.
- C. During the performance of this contract, the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below:
1. Terminate or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
 2. Consider possible debarment of the prime contractor from bidding.
 3. Withhold payments on the contract.
 4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.

II. Definitions

- A. "SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE" (SBE) means a small business concern that is 51% owned, operated and controlled by one or more individuals who are a minority, woman and/or a small business owner (who is at an "economic disadvantage"). The individuals must have day-to-day operational and managerial control and interest in capital, financial risks and earnings commensurate with the percentage of their ownership.
- B. "OWNED, OPERATED AND CONTROLLED" means a business which is one of the following:
1. A sole proprietorship legitimately owned and operated and controlled by a minority, women or an individual at a disadvantage as defined in Chapter 370.
 2. A partnership or joint venture legitimately owned, operated and controlled by individuals who are minorities, women or individuals who are at a disadvantage and who own at least 51% of the beneficial ownership interests in the enterprise and who hold at least 51% of the voting interests of the enterprise eligible as defined in Chapter 370.

3. A corporation legitimately owned, operated and controlled by one or more individuals who are a minority, woman or individual at a disadvantage and who own at least 51% of the outstanding shares and who hold at least 51% of the voting interests of the corporation eligible as defined in Chapter 370.

III. SBE Utilization Requirements

- A. Each prime contractor shall utilize SBE to the minimum percent listed in the Acknowledgements section/page and or Official Notice Document for this contract. Note that the prime contractors shall be required to attain SBE participation on their base bid excluding specified allowances, alternatives, and change orders. SBE commitments relative to contract award shall be based upon the approved SBE Compliance Plan (Form A).
- B. The determination of SBE utilization shall be based on the following criteria:
 1. The firms identified as SBE by the prime contractor on the SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) must be certified by the Office of Small Business Development prior to bid opening.
 2. The prime contractor shall be credited for the entire expenditure to SBE firms only if all of the identified scope of work is performed directly by the certified SBE firm.
 3. The prime contractor shall be credited for the entire expenditure to SBE manufacturer only if the manufacturer produces goods from raw materials or substantially alters them for resale. Only 20% of the SBE goals may be expended for SBE suppliers that do not manufacture products they supply.
 4. The prime contractor shall count toward the SBE requirement only those payments to SBEs who perform a commercially-useful function in the actual performance of the contract. While that generally means an SBE should be engaged in direct contract work, a "commercially-useful function" may also include management of a third tier subcontractor. For example, while an SBE trucking subcontractor is always expected to perform some direct work on the project, in some cases it may become necessary to subcontract work out to one or more third tier subcontractors. If a third tier subcontractor is also an SBE, the full amount of the work performed by that third tier SBE can be counted toward SBE participation. However, if the third party subcontractor is not an SBE, the prime contractor may only count 20% of the amount being subcontracted to the third tier non-SBE subcontractor. SBEs are required to notify the Department of Public Works if they subcontract out work so that the Department can determine how much, if any, of the subcontracted work can be counted toward the SBE requirement. The Commissioner of Public Works will make the final determination and evaluation of whether the SBE is performing a commercially-useful function.
- C. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that the contractor understands the provisions of Chapter 370 and knows of and intends to comply with them. The completed SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) must be submitted by the apparent low bid contractor within three (3) working days after the identification of the "low bidder."
 1. Information on Form A shall include, but not be limited to:
 - a. The names, addresses, telephone numbers, SBE Certification designation and contact person names for the certified SBE contractors that will participate on the project as subcontractors or suppliers;
 - b. A description of the scope of work to be performed by the SBE on this project; and
 - c. The SBE contractor dollar value(s) and corresponding percentages that the dollar values represent of the total contract amount.

2. Listing an SBE on the Compliance Plan (Form A) shall constitute a representation that the contractor has communicated directly with the SBEs listed. If awarded the contract, the bidder will enter into a subcontract with the firm for the portion of the work listed.
3. SBE participation is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified SBE requirements will render the bid unresponsive. The contract may then be awarded to the next apparent low bidder. Under certain circumstances, failure to meet specified SBE requirements after submission of an apparent low bid may result in surrender of the bidder's bid bond.
4. Only SBEs that have been certified by the Office of Small Business Development may be listed on the SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) and counted towards the percentage requirements on this project. A listing of the currently City certified SBE firms is maintained at:

- D. After execution of the contract, if for any reason an SBE cannot perform, the prime contractor shall contact the Commissioner of Public Works for approval to substitute another certified SBE firm. The prime contractor must submit a written request for substitution which specifies the reasons for the request. Approval must be obtained prior to making substitutions. Any difference in the cost occasioned by such substitution shall be borne by the prime contractor. If the prime contractor cannot find another certified firm to do the work at a comparable price, a non-SBE firm may be substituted with the approval of the Commissioner of Public Works.
- E. If the prime contractor has a problem in meeting the SBE requirements or if any other problems relative to SBE(s) arise during the completion of this project, the prime contractor shall immediately contact the Commissioner of Public Works.
- F. Certification from programs other than the Office of Small Business Development is neither accepted by the City of Milwaukee nor do they have any bearing whatsoever on the eligibility criteria established by the City of Milwaukee.
- G. Right to Appeal.

All contracts awarded under ss.7-14-2 and 7-22 of the City Charter shall be awarded by the Commissioner of Public Works to the lowest responsible bidder determined in accordance with applicable City ordinances for participation of the Office of Small Business Development. Following the opening of any bid involving a determination under applicable City ordinances for participation of SBE, the Commissioner of Public Works shall make a written recommendation as to the lowest responsible bidder and notify all bidders by publication in an official City newspaper as to the content of the written recommendation. Any bidder who objects to the recommendation on grounds of determinations made under applicable City ordinances for participation of SBE may appeal the recommendation on such grounds by filing a written appeal with the Commissioner of Public Works within five (5) working days of the date of publication. The appeal shall state the specific objection to the recommendation, include supporting documentation and specify an alternative recommendation. The Commissioner of Public Works shall schedule a hearing before an appeals committee consisting of the Chair of the Economic Development Committee or the Chair's designee, a member of the Economic Development Committee selected by the Chair and the Director of the Office of Small Business Development to be held within five (5) days of receipt of the appeal. The Committee shall have authority by majority vote to affirm or set aside the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works and its decision in this regard shall be final. In the event a timely appeal, meeting the requirements above is not filed, or the Committee affirms

the Commissioner's recommendation following a timely appeal, meeting the requirements above, the Commissioner shall make an award in accordance with the recommendation.

Residents Preference Program Provisions

I. General

- A. In accordance with Chapter 309 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, residents preference hiring is required for all construction contracting activities of the Department of Public Works. The ordinance requires that 40% of WORKER HOURS worked on a DPW contract be performed by UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City, except in special cases where the Commissioner of Public Works determines there is sufficient reason to impose lesser levels of participation. Further, the Commissioner of Public Works may increase the percentage of RESIDENT worker participation to more than 40% on specific contracts. For this contract, bidders are required to show that the minimum percent of WORKER HOURS, as listed in the acknowledgements section/page and/or the Official Notice document will be performed by UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City. Up to one-third of required worker hours may be achieved by documenting the use of UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS on projects undertaken by the contractor where such compliance is not required, or by hiring UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS on a full-time permanent basis for non-construction job categories connected to the project. Such adjustments must be proposed in an affidavit on a form provided by the department setting forth the facts upon which the request for adjustment is based.
- B. The contractor, prior to commencing work, shall submit an affidavit (Form I) for proof of residency for all employees utilized by the contractor and subcontractors to meet the Residents Preference Program requirements, stating that each employee is either UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED and is a RESIDENT of the City. The contractor shall prepare and submit accurate and timely resident utilization forms and reports to the Department of Public Works. Time Reports shall be submitted within ten (10) days following completion of work, or every three months, whichever comes first. The reports shall identify the name, address, race, gender, work classification, wage rates and hours worked of all employees utilized on the contract by the contractor and all subcontractors. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until the summary of hours worked on the back of the Prime Contractor's Affidavit of Compliance is completed and on file with the Department of Public Works. Forms shall be submitted to DPW, Room 506, Municipal Building, 841 North Broadway, Milwaukee, WI 53202.
- C. During the performance of this contract the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, or if the contractor, prime or sub, submits any documents which contain any false, misleading, or fraudulent information, or if the contractor or subcontractor fail to comply with this ordinance, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below.
1. Withhold payments on the contract.
 2. Terminate or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
 3. Consider possible debarment of the contractor from bidding for a period of up to two years.
 4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.
- D. The penalty for any person, firm, or corporation knowingly engaging in fraud, misrepresentation, or in any attempt directly or indirectly, to evade the provisions of this ordinance by providing false, misleading, or fraudulent information shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$1,000 or more than \$5,000 together with the costs of prosecution and, upon default of payment, shall be imprisoned in the county jail or house of correction not to exceed 90 days, or until the forfeiture costs are paid.

II. Definitions

- A. RESIDENT – A person who maintains his or her place of permanent abode in the City of Milwaukee. Domiciliary intent is required to establish that a person is maintaining his or her place of permanent

abode in the City. Mere ownership of real property is not sufficient to establish domiciliary intent. Evidence of domiciliary intent includes, without limitations, the location where a person votes, pays personal income taxes, or obtains a driver's license.

- B. UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED – a RESIDENT that has worked less than 1,200 hours in the preceding 12 months or has not worked in the preceding 30 days or, regardless of employment status, has household income at or below the federal poverty guidelines as adjusted by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction to define eligibility for reduced lunch in public schools. A RESIDENT will continue to qualify as unemployed or underemployed for five (5) years from the date he or she first participates in a contract under Chapter 309. If a RESIDENT becomes an apprentice for a contractor or becomes a participant in an on-the-job training program as determined by the City immediately after or in the course of performing on a particular construction contract, he or she shall continue to qualify as unemployed or underemployed for a period not exceeding 5 years from the date the person became an apprentice or participant in such on-the-job training program.
- C. WORKER HOURS – means the total hours worked on a construction contract by skilled and unskilled construction trade workers, whether those workers are employed by the contractor or any subcontractor. In determining the total worker hours to be furnished at a construction site, the number of hours devoted to all tasks customarily performed on a construction site shall be included, whether or not such tasks are performed on the construction site. "Worker hours" includes work performed by persons filling apprenticeships and participating in on-the-job training programs and excludes the number of hours of work performed by all non-Wisconsin residents.

III. Residency Utilization Requirements

- A. The contractor shall utilize UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City in a minimum amount equal to the percentage of the WORKER HOURS as stated in paragraph IA above.
- B. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that it understands the provisions of Chapter 309 and knows of and intends to comply with them, and shall ensure that all subcontractors are also informed.
- C. The contractor shall maintain, and shall ensure that all subcontractors maintain, personnel records listing the name, address, race and gender of all employees utilized for this contract and any records demonstrating that the employees utilized by the contractor in meeting the residency requirements are actual residents of the City. These records shall be maintained for seven (7) years after the contractor has received final payment under the contract and shall be made available to the Commissioner of Public Works upon reasonable notice.
- D. Compliance with these residency requirements is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified residency requirements will render the bid unresponsive, and the Commissioner of Public Works may then recommend the award to the next apparent low bidder.
- E. The City recognizes the following organization which can be contacted for access to trained or qualified workers from the City. Other organizations or sources of qualified RESIDENTS can be used at the bidder's discretion.

- F. If the prime contractor has problems in meeting the residency requirements or if any other problems relative to residency participation arise during the completion of this project, the prime contractor shall immediately contact the Commissioner of Public Works.
- G. Right to Appeal – All contracts awarded under ss. 7-14-2 and 7-22 of the City Charter shall be awarded by the Commissioner of Public Works to the lowest responsible bidder determined in accordance with any applicable City ordinances relating to the participation of Small Business Enterprise Programs or requiring participation of City RESIDENTS. Following the opening of any bid where the Commissioner has considered compliance with such City ordinances, the Commissioner shall publish in an official City newspaper his or her determination as to the lowest responsible bidder. Any bidder who objects to the determination based on the consideration of such City Ordinances, may appeal the recommendation by filing a written appeal with the Commissioner within five (5) working days of the date of publication. The appeal shall state the specific objection to the determination, including supporting documentation, and specify an alternative determination. Any appeals that do not conform to this section shall not be

considered. The Commissioner shall schedule a hearing before the Public Works Contract Appeals Committee which shall be comprised of the chair of the Economic Development Committee or his or her designee and a member of the Economic Development Committee selected by the chair and the Director of Administration or his or her designee to be held within five days of receipt of the appeal. The Public Works Contract Appeals Committee shall have the authority by majority vote to affirm or set aside the determination of the Commissioner and their decision in this regard shall be final. In the event that a timely appeal meeting the requirements of this paragraph is not filed, or the Committee affirms the Commissioner's determination following a timely appeal, the Commissioner shall make an award in accordance with his or her determination.

Apprenticeship Provisions

I. General:

- A. In accordance with Section 309-38 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, apprenticeship requirements will be specified on all Department of Public Works construction contracts, where appropriate, which are in excess of \$100,000. The ordinance requires that a contractor employ apprentices in the performance of the contract and of all subcontracts entered into by the contractor in accordance with the maximum ratio of apprentices to journeymen as established by the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor, and Human Relations. Fair consideration must be given to minorities and women. For this contract, bidders are required to utilize apprentice(s) from _____ of the following trade(s):

(See "Ratio of Apprentices to Journeymen").

- B. The contractor shall prepare and submit an accurate and timely Apprenticeship Utilization Form (Form F) and other reports to the Department of Public Works. The Apprenticeship Utilization Form shall be returned with the executed contract and shall specifically identify the apprentice(s) that will work on the project. The Contractor Time Report shall be submitted within ten (10) days following completion of work or every three (3) months, whichever comes first. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until all apprenticeship related reports are on file with the Department of Public Works.
- C. During the performance of this contract the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, or if the contractor, prime or sub, submits any documents which contain any false, misleading, or fraudulent information, or if the contractor or subcontractor fail to comply with this ordinance, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below:
1. Withhold payments on the contract.
 2. Terminate, suspend, or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
 3. After due process, consider debarment of the contractor from bidding for a two-year period.
 4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.

II. Definitions:

- A. Apprentice - a person, 16 years of age or over, who shall enter into a written contract of service where he or she is to receive from or through his or her employer in consideration for his or her services, in whole or in part, instruction in any trade, craft, or business. Apprenticeship agreements shall be governed by Ch. 106, Wis. Stats.

- B. Construction - Means either new construction work or repair work on any roads, bridges, sewers, streets, alleys, buildings, or any other public works.

III. Apprenticeship Utilization Requirements:

- A. The contractor shall utilize apprentices in a minimum amount equal to that stated in paragraph I-A above.
- B. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that the contractor understands the provisions of Chapter 309 and knows of and intends to comply with them.
- C. The contractor shall maintain personnel records listing the names and addresses of its employees utilized for this contract in meeting apprenticeship requirements. These records shall be maintained for three (3) years after the contractor has received final payment under the contract and shall be made available to the Commissioner of Public Works upon reasonable notice.
- D. Compliance with these apprenticeship requirements is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified apprenticeship requirements will render the bid unresponsive, and the Commissioner of Public Works may then recommend award to the next apparent low bidder.
- E. If the prime contractor has problems in meeting the apprenticeship requirements or if any other problems relative to apprenticeship participation arise during the completion of this project, the prime contractor shall immediately contact the Commissioner of Public Works.

(a) Each contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent performing work on a project of public works that is subject to this section shall keep full and accurate records clearly indicating the name and trade or occupation of every person performing the work described in sub. (4) and an accurate record of the number of hours worked by each of those persons and the actual wages paid for the hours worked.

s. 66.0903 (11) LIABILITY AND PENALTIES.

(a) 1. Any contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent who fails to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or who pays less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor is liable to any affected employee in the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and in an additional amount as liquidated damages as provided under subd. 2., 3., whichever is applicable.

2. If the department determines upon inspection under sub. (10) (b) or (c) that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.

3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.

5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.

BUILDING OR HEAVY CONSTRUCTION

Includes sheltered enclosures with walk-in access for the purpose of housing persons, employees, machinery, equipment or supplies and non-sheltered work such as canals, dams, dikes, reservoirs, storage tanks, etc. A sheltered enclosure need not be "habitable" in order to be considered a building.
