ST230150150 – Sidewalk Replacements – Scattered Sites

1. Work shall be performed in accordance with the *Street Construction Specifications of the Infrastructure Services Division*, dated July 1, 1992 and addenda, if any; superseded by and in accordance with the *Construction Section Special Provisions for Sidewalk Repair by Contract*, dated, July 7, 2011, which is attached; superseded by and in accordance the following *Project Special Provisions*.
2. All work shall be completed by November 25, 2015 except for the Transportation Bike Pads are to be completed by August 28, 2015 for the following locations:
 - Northwest corner of N. Pleasant St. and N. Commerce St.
 - N. Commerce St. at N. Holton St./ Marsupial Bridge West
 - North side of E. Ogden St. at N. Jackson St. just west of East Pointe Marketplace
 - Southwest corner of E. Juneau Ave. and E. Waverly Pl.
 - Northeast corner S. 6th St. and W. Virginia St.
 - Southwest corner of N. 8th St. and W. Wisconsin Ave./Central Library
 - Southwest corner N. 6th St. and W. Galena St./Hillside Terrace
3. The erosion control item on this contract shall include an Erosion Control Implementation Plan (ECIP). The ECIP shall be submitted to the City Engineer, at least ten (10) working days prior to the scheduled start of work on the contract. The City Engineer shall review the ECIP for meeting technical standards and notify the contractor if the plan meets the standard within seven (7) working days. Work shall not start until the ECIP meets technical standards. The contractor shall be required to have a copy of the ECIP on the job site for the entire duration of the contract. The ECIP shall include, but not be limited to:
 - ➡ A plan showing all locations of erosion control devices and other *Best Management Practices (BMP's)*.
 - ➡ A written description of all erosion control devices and *BMP's* to be used.
 - ➡ A written schedule of installing erosion control devices.
 - ➡ A written schedule of construction operations related to implementing erosion control devices and *BMP's*.
 - ➡ A written maintenance schedule for all erosion control devices and *BMP's*.

All costs associated with implementing the erosion control plan, such as furnishing, installing, maintaining, and removal of erosion control devices shall be included in the unit price bid for erosion control. There shall be no additional compensation for revising the ECIP or utilizing additional *BMP's* in order to comply with *Chapter 290* of the *City of Milwaukee Code of Ordinances*. If the contractor is found not in compliance with the ECIP, the contractor will be subject to the penalties included in *Chapter 290*.
4. **Work Location Maps and List** attached. The City reserves the right to adjust the bid quantities on this contract. The bid quantities may be changed up to twenty-five percent (25%) without being a basis for a change in bid price.
5. **Sod.** All sod placement and maintenance shall be included in the concrete replacement bid prices except for Sod replacement for "removal only" areas shall be paid at fourteen dollars (\$14.00) per square yard.

6. **Access walk** between the main sidewalk and the curb (carriage walk) and between the main sidewalk and the street line (yard walk) shall be replaced at the original locations or other designated area when directed. Access walks, radius corners, and other miscellaneous walk removal shall be replaced at the same time the main sidewalk is replaced.

When the access walk is removed only, and topsoil and sod are called for, the contractor shall include this work in his bid price for removal.

7. **Ingress and Egress.** The work shall be arranged so that there is minimum interference with ingress and egress to business establishments. Temporary wooden pedestrian walkways shall be provided when directed. Where the sidewalk portion of a driveway is removed, planking shall be placed when directed.
8. **Sawing** shall be to a depth necessary to avoid any damage to abutting sidewalk, pavement, curb and gutter, etc. Sawing, whether originally marked out or added during the progress of the contract, will be paid at the price bid for sawing. The sawing of blind joints to facilitate removals shall be included in the price bid for removals.
9. **Time Limitation of Removal of Material.** All excess material shall be removed from the site of each operation within **two (2) days** after material has been deposited. In business areas, this material shall be removed on the same day as deposited. **No material** shall be placed in the gutter so as to block drainage.
10. **Barricading.** The contractor shall comply with the current **Work Zone Safety Guidelines for Construction, Maintenance and Utility Operation.**

The contractor may temporarily close a residential street to vehicular traffic during the daily walk removal operation. The contractor shall furnish all traffic control and *No parking* signs as required. No Parking signs shall be placed no sooner than twenty-four (24) hours prior to removals and must be removed the same day concrete is placed. All barricading and signing shall be included in the unit bid price for removals.

11. **Notification to City of Milwaukee Utilities.** The contractor shall contact *Diggers Hotline* (800) 242-8511 for this notification. *Diggers Hotline* must be notified a minimum of seventy-two (72) hours prior to any removal of sidewalk.

The contractor must notify the *Signal Shop*, (414) 286-3687 at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of construction at signalized intersections and at locations where full walk will affect traffic sign placement.

The contractor shall report any accidental damages to *Street Lighting Field Operations* at (414) 286-3015 as soon as possible. The contractor will be held liable for costs incurred for damage repair and for relocation work requested for contractor convenience.

The contractor shall contact Mr. Rollin Bertran at (414) 286-3437 at least five (5) working days before starting work on the seven (7) Transportation Bike Pads.

ST230150150 – Sidewalk Replacements – Scattered Sites

The contractor must keep the area behind the curb free from over pour and other debris. He will be held responsible for costs incurred by *Street Lighting Forces* for cleaning debris from behind the curb.

If the contractor requests the relocation of any street lighting facilities, *permanent or temporary*, for his convenience, he will be responsible for all costs incurred by *Street Lighting* personnel fulfilling his request.

Any questions regarding the design of the lighting system are to be directed to *Street Lighting Engineering* at (414) 286-3265.

12. **Water Box/Gate Valve Adjustment:** The contractor shall protect and adjust any water service and/or gate valve boxes encountered with in work area. Costs for this work should be included in the bid price for concrete walk, driveway and curb and gutter.

The contractor shall notify the Water Department at the time of removal of concrete containing a water service or gate valve box. The Water Department shall check, repair, and rough adjust the boxes or valves prior to replacement of the concrete. For water box locations, the contractor shall notify Milwaukee Water Works by contacting Mr. Jesse Hernandez, (414) 286-6306 or (414) 708-2670. After contract completion, water service and gate valve boxes will be checked to insure that they are clean, vertical and usable. Boxes, which are located and marked in the landscaped areas, which are damaged during progress on the contract, will be repaired by the City and the cost deducted from contract payments.

13. **Contractors' hours of work and working area are restrictions:**

A. Arterial Streets

- i. On divided highways, maintain one minimum eleven (11') foot traffic lane for each direction on the proper side of the road.
- ii. On non-divided highways maintain one minimum eleven (11') foot traffic lane for each direction.
- iii. On one-way streets maintain one minimum eleven (11') foot traffic lane.

B. Inbound Traffic Lanes

- i. When work is not in progress and from **7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.** the contractor shall leave open the inbound traffic lanes.

C. Outbound Traffic Lanes

- i. When work is not in progress, and from **3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.**, the contractor shall leave open the outbound traffic lanes.
- ii. The definition of inbound is all traffic leading to the Central Business District and the definition of outbound is all traffic lanes leaving the Central Business District.

D. School Zones

- i. When school is in session, work adjacent to schools shall be conducted between **9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.** to avoid congestion with the arrival and departure of school buses, unless the contractor can make other arrangements with the schools.

14. Removal of Sidewalk and Driveway**A. Damage to Adjacent Sidewalk, Lawn, Etc.**

Adjacent sidewalk stones which have been damaged through carelessness shall be replaced by the contractor at their own expense. Damaged lawns, shrubbery, flagstone, block, brick, steps, walks or other private property shall be replaced or repaired by the contractor at his own expense.

B. Grading and Gravel Fill

Gravel or crushed stone used for sub-grade preparation is to be included in the concrete replacement bid prices. In certain cases where extra gravel fill is needed (for example: hollow walks and double walk/driveway) the gravel fill will be paid at the fixed extra price.

C. Walk/Driveway Abandonment

At walk or driveway abandonment's, included as part of the original bid quantities, the area shall be backfilled and compacted with a sandy loam to a clay soil except for the top two (2") inches which shall be screened topsoil. The cost for this work shall be included in the unit bid price for walk/driveway removal.

D. Removal of Excess Patching Material

Concrete, bituminous mixes or other types of material used to ramp raised sidewalk shall be removed from adjacent sidewalk stones prior to placing the forms for the new sidewalk.

15. Placement of Sidewalk and Driveways

A. Adjusting Adjacent Sidewalk. The cost of adjusting or raising sidewalk stones, adjacent to new work, to the proper elevations shall be included in the concrete replacement bid prices. The raising or adjusting of the adjacent sidewalk stones shall be completed at the time the forms are placed. An area equal to one cubic foot shall be excavated under each sidewalk stone adjusted by the contractor and filled with concrete when placing adjacent stone.

B. Patching Adjacent Sidewalk. Pieces of sidewalk, cleanly broken adjacent to new work, shall be neatly patched with concrete. Surface edges of adjoining concrete chipped during removal shall be sawed by contractor (*no pay for contractor and non-assessable*).

C. Concrete Spillage. Excess concrete from finishing operations and from spillage on adjacent sidewalks shall be removed ***immediately***.

D. Placement of Joints and Expansion Joint Material. Joint and expansion joint material shall be placed and constructed as stated in *Section 503.5 of the Street Construction Specifications* with the following additional requirements:

- If the face of the adjoining sidewalk forms a straight line and is to grade, the new sidewalk shall be poured against it and edged.

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- If the face of the adjoining sidewalk forms a jagged line and is to grade, the edge shall be sawed, when directed, to a straight line and the contractor will be paid as stated in the contract bid price for sawing.
 - If adjoining sidewalk is not to grade, the new sidewalk shall be poured against it and edged whenever possible and a dummy joint located a minimum of five (5') feet away to form a ramp whose maximum slope shall not exceed one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$ ") inch per foot.
 - Expansion joint material shall be placed adjacent to existing sidewalk stones which have a longitudinal crack or cracks through the entire length of the stone.
 - Seven (7") inch expansion joint materials shall be placed adjacent to driveway.
 - Where concrete is placed on both sides of expansion joint material, a separator plate or equivalent shall be used to ensure construction of a straight joint.
 - The dimensions of the new stones shall be uniform in size.
- E. Concrete Walk with Integral Curb.** When directed, concrete walk with integral curb shall be constructed as stated in *Section 503.2.4 Street Construction Specification*, dated July 1, 1992. This construction shall consist of a standard five (5") inch concrete sidewalk with a vertical face curb six (6") inches in thickness, built monolithically with the sidewalk. The vertical curb shall extend a minimum of nine (9") inches below the surface of the existing roadway pavement. Tie bars will be placed in the curb section as directed. The face of the curb section shall be properly finished and brushed to a point, a minimum of two (2") inches below the pavement surface. The joint in the sidewalk shall run through the face of the curb section.
- Curb and walk removal shall be included in the bid price for concrete walk with integral curb. Measurement for payment will be made in accordance with *Section 503.6, Street Construction Specifications*
- F. Limitation of Removal.** Sidewalk shall be replaced within three workdays after it has been removed. Sidewalks adjoining business properties shall be replaced ***within twenty-four (24) hours.***
- G. Defaced Surface.** When possible, defaced work shall be repaired within the same day as finishing operations, and in all cases, shall be repaired by the end of the following work day.
16. The contractor shall furnish and install detectable warning plates as detailed on the attached curb and sidewalk ramp details, at all curb and sidewalk ramps, within the project limits. The detectable warning plates shall be a *Neenah Foundry R-4984*, or an approved equal. The plates shall be unpainted. The installation of the detectable warning plates shall follow the manufacturers' suggested procedures. The installed detectable warning plates shall be measured on a per square foot unit basis, and paid under the item, *50330 Detectable Warning Field*.
17. Contractor shall be aware of **design revisions** made to **Concrete Driveways**, (*Figures 21A, 21C, 23A, 23B and 26A*). **Design changes** were also made to **Curb Ramps**, (*Figures 16A, 17A and 18A*). These **changes** are effective immediately and shall be implemented under this contract. (*See attached revised drawings*).

18. Ready-mixed Concrete**A. Addition of Water**

No water shall be added after the initial introduction of mixing water to the batch except when on arrival at the job site the slump of the concrete is less than specified. When the addition of water is necessary, the drum shall be turned an additional thirty (30) revolutions at mixing speed. ***At no time*** shall water be added after fifty percent (50%) of the load has been discharged.

- B. High Early Strength Concrete.** Contractor will be paid at the Fixed Extra rate of one hundred fifteen (115%) percent of the bid price of driveways for seven (7)-bag concrete, when placed as directed. If High Early Strength Concrete is placed for the convenience of the contractor, there will be no-pay for additional costs incurred by the contractor.

19. Backfilling, Landscaping and Clean-up

- A. Backfilling.** The excavated areas adjacent to the sidewalk shall be backfilled with approved screened topsoil and properly compacted by means of hand or mechanical tamper prior to placing the sod (if called for) to prevent settlement. All debris shall be removed from the excavated areas prior to placement of the topsoil.
- B. Locations Requiring Asphalt Replacement.** In areas where asphalt is to be placed, the contractor shall backfill with gravel where necessary. The gravel shall be compacted to a sub-grade two (2") inches below the finished grade of the sidewalk. At all locations where asphalt is to be placed, the contractor shall trim the edges vertically, leaving a firm and clean face free from dirt, clay or foreign materials. This trimming shall be done in a straight line whenever possible. The contractor shall remove any loose materials, leaving a clean base. This work shall be accomplished within two (2) days after concrete is poured. The asphalt work will be done by City forces. The contractor shall be responsible for maintaining barricades until work is completed. The cost of asphalt restoration preparation adjacent to new work shall be included in the concrete replacement bid.
- C. Sod work.** The contractor shall replace all grass or sod that is removed and damaged with nursery grown *Kentucky Blue* or *Merion Kentucky Blue* sod. The minimum width of sod placed shall be 6-inches. Sod shall be neatly placed and hand-tamped to a uniform firmness and grade. The contractor shall thoroughly water the sod immediately after it is set in place. The sod shall be maintained and watered by the contractor for two (2) weeks after placement. The maintenance shall become the responsibility of the property owner only after growth has been established and the sod work has been accepted by the Commissioner.
- D. Clean-Up.** All debris from backfilling and any sod operation shall be swept up and removed from the area within one (1) workday.
- E. Restoration Time Limitations.** Backfilling, clean-up, placing of top soil or sod, and repair of damage at each work location shall be completed within five (5) work days after finishing operations unless otherwise directed by the Commissioner

20. This special provision is a substitute for Section 305.7 of the *Street Construction Specifications*, dated 1992. The amount of the per diem charge for inspection as referred to in part two (2) shall be **\$325.00**. The contractor should be aware that work on each project is governed by the project workdays, and a per diem inspectional charge of **\$325.00** per day will be assessed for each workday after the allotted number. Inspectional charges will be assessed against each project, which exceeds its allotted number of workdays. An inspectional charge, in addition to the project workday charge, will be assessed if the number of workdays for the overall contract exceeds the amount allotted.
21. The contractor shall provide a portable toilet or portable toilet service on each project location in the contract for use by construction and City personnel. Facilities shall be promptly removed upon completion of each individual project. Facilities shall be locked and secured during non-working hours. (Location shall be as directed). The entire cost of this work shall be included in the unit price bid for mobilization.
22. **Forestry**

Forestry Special Provisions include:

When tree roots are encountered, the following shall apply:

1. **Sidewalk Construction:**

- A. Sidewalks are to be removed, and roots cut, by use of **hand implements only**.

2. **Curb, Gutter and Road Construction:**

- A. Exposed tree roots shall be covered with mulch and watered from a period immediately following curb and gutter removal until the area is backfilled following construction.

1. **General Requirements:**

- A. All cutting for the removal of sod and soil in order to establish a finished grade within four feet (4') of existing trees must be done manually if necessary.
- B. No construction equipment, cars, trucks or materials shall be parked or stored on any median or tree border on this project or adjacent roadways.
- C. Root foundations must remain adequate to withstand heavy windstorms.
- D. Root systems of street trees **shall not be cut** for the installation of any type of cable by the contractor or City Department. Contact **the Forestry Division at (414) 708-2428** for directional boring specifications.
- E. Caution should be used during the construction process to avoid damage to the roots, trunks, and branches of all street trees. Damage caused to any street tree or irrigation system will be **repaired by the Forestry Division** and the costs of

repair, rejuvenation, and/or value lost will be billed to the contractor or credited against the contract at the option of the City.

- F. At locations where the contractor has not complied with the Forestry Special Requirements stated in the Special Provisions above, and the maximum clearance was exceeded, or a thin form was not used, a minimum credit to the City of **fifty dollars (\$50.00)** per location will be taken. The credit will increase in proportion to the excess distance beyond clearance allowed. The credit will be **(\$50.00)** for each two-inch (2") increment, or part thereof, in excess of the initial clearance allowed. Any damage to the tree's structure totaling fifteen (15%) percent of the tree's value will be billed on a prorata basis. If, in the opinion of the Forestry Division, the tree has been damaged to the point that it warrants removal, the credit that will be taken will be equal to **one-hundred dollars (\$100.00)** per inch diameter of the tree. A field measurement will be taken to determine the tree size.

23. Specification references in special provision no. 18 above:

A. Excavation for Roadway Widening

Summary

This section includes Excavation for Roadway Widening.

This work shall consist of supplying all the necessary materials, labor and equipment to excavate along the existing roadway in preparation for placement of dense graded base for widening of the existing roadway to the proposed width indicated in the project specifications, plans, or as directed by the engineer.

The locations of Excavation for Roadway Widening are shown on the plans.

Construction

Roadway excavation shall consist of the excavation and disposal of all material taken along the edge of the existing roadway so as to provide a stable sub-grade on which to place the prepared base material that will serve as the base for the widened roadway. It is the Contractor's responsibility to excavate to the depth necessary to provide for a stable sub-grade.

Density Requirement – Sub-grade shall be rolled and compacted to meet a ninety-five percent (95) modified proctor density.

Measurement and Payment

Unit Prices: Measurement and payment for Excavation and Roadway Widening shall be according to the unit price for Cutting and quantity measured in the field.

B. Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement

Summary

This section includes Pulverized Re-Laid Pavement

This work shall consist of supplying all the necessary materials, labor and equipment to perform full depth in-place pulverizing of the existing asphaltic pavement along with a portion of the underlying base and relaying the pulverized material to construct a new base as indicated in the project specifications, plans as directed by the City Engineer.

The location of Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement are shown on the plans.

Execution

1. Preparation

- a. Offsetting centerline and structures – The areas of Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement will be marked in the field by the City. Prior to pulverizing, the Contractor shall locate the existing centerline and any existing structures including, but not limited to, sanitary sewer manholes, water valves, gas valves, telephone manholes, and section corners. The Contractor shall place offset stakes along the side of the roadway perpendicular to these locations. The Contractor shall measure and record the offset distances from the stakes to these locations to be used to re-establish the centerline and to protect from damage all existing structures during the pulverizing and grading process. The Contractor is responsible for damage to said structures during construction.

2. Materials

- a. Graduation – The Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement shall conform to the following graduation requirements: One-hundred (100) percent of the pulverized material shall pass a one and a half (1½) inch sieve and ninety-five (95) percent shall pass a one (1) inch sieve. Should the material not meet these requirements after one pass of the pulverizing equipment, additional passes shall be made as necessary and at no additional cost to the CITY, until the graduation requirements are met. The Contractor shall, at his/her cost, remove from the site any material that cannot be reduced to less than one and a half (1½) inch diameter.
- b. Density – The Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement shall be compacted to a uniform density of not less than ninety-five (95) percent of modified proctor for the material on that roadway. The CITY reserves the right to perform random density tests. Should area be found that does not meet the minimum density requirements, the boundaries of these areas will be determined by taking additional density tests at one-hundred (100) feet intervals until acceptable densities are obtained. These areas shall be reworked and re-compacted at no additional cost, until acceptable densities are achieved.

3. Construction

- a. General – Pulverize the pavement to its full depth including the specified depth of base material and grade the pulverized pavement and base material to the specified width **to be paved**. The Contractor shall distribute the pulverized material to provide the required widths **to be paved** shown in the contract as well as provide a smooth profile to a two (2) percent cross slope to provide the proper crown or super-elevation, or to raise or lower the base elevation as directed by the City Engineer. Grading operation

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shall include redistribution of material as necessary over the project limits to meet plan grades.

- b. Excess Pulverized Material Left in Windrow for Shouldering – The existing street has aggregate shoulders, excess pulverized base material is expected to be available based on existing pavement and base thicknesses, a windrow of pulverized material approximately eight (8) inches high along each side of the roadway in the shoulder area shall be left to be used at a later time for fly ash stabilization and / or shouldering. The windrow shall be incidental to the item "Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement."
- c. Unsuitable Sub-Base – If during the grading and compaction of the pulverized material, the Contractor encounters areas of unstable or soft sub-base material which prevents him from constructing and compacting a stable pavement base, the Contractor shall contact the City Engineer so that alternate measures can be proposed, agreed to, and implemented to fix the problem areas.
- d. Proof Roll – After final compaction and prior to asphaltic paving, the Contractor shall conduct a proof roll of the Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement to determine whether the new base is acceptable for asphaltic paving. The Contractor shall provide one full day notice of the City Engineer when requesting and scheduling a proof roll and the proof roll must be witnessed by a representative of the City Engineer. The Contractor shall provide a fully loaded water truck, tri-axle or quad-axle truck of proof rolling. The proof roll shall be conducted for the entire length of each street in each traffic lane. If any areas of the roadway base deflect more than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) inch, the Contractor shall rework, re-compact, and perform another proof roll on these areas. If it is mutually determined by the City and the Contractor that these areas cannot pass the proof roll due to an unstable or soft sub-base, alternate measures can be proposed, agreed to, and implemented to fix the problem.
- e. Time Requirement – Once a street is pulverized, the Contractor shall grade and compact the pulverized material, obtain the required density, pass a proof roll, and place the asphaltic lower layer on the street within five (5) working days.

Measurement and Payment

Unit Prices – Measurement and payment for Pulverized and Re-Laid Pavement shall be according to the unit prices specified on the bid form, and quantities measured in the field using length and width of the existing pavement.

C. Fly Ash Stabilized Recycled Asphalt Base

Summary

This section includes: Fly Ash Stabilized Recycled Asphalt Base

References:

- WisDOT – Standard Specifications for Highway and Structure Construction – Section 325

- ASTM C-618 – Standard Specification for Coal Fly Ash and Raw or Calcined Natural Pozzolan for Use as a Mineral Admixture in Concrete
- ASTM D-698 – Test Method for laboratory Compaction Characteristics for Soil Using Standard Effort
- ASTM D-5239 – Standard Practice for Characterizing Fly Ash for Use in Soil Stabilization
- ASTM C-593 – Compaction Testing
- ASTM D-1557 – Moisture Density

This work shall consist of supplying all the necessary materials, labor and equipment to stabilize the recycled pavement and base with class C fly ash as indicated in the project specifications, plans, or as directed by the engineer. Note that based on initial proof roll, the engineer will have the option to reduce or eliminate the area of fly ash stabilization.

The locations of Fly Ash Stabilized Recycled Asphalt Base are as shown on the plans.

Submittals

Submittals shall be sent to the City for the following:

- Fly Ash Test Results
- Mix Proportion Test Results

Materials

1. Fly Ash – The fly ash shall be self-cementing and meet the physical requirements of ASTM D-5239 6/4 maintaining a minimum compressive strength of 500 psi at seven (7) days, and the chemical requirements of ASTM Specifications C-618, table 1, for Class "C" fly ash. Self-cementing fly ash not meeting the above requirements can be used, provided the sulfur trioxide content does not exceed ten (10) percent and the self-cementing properties have been demonstrated to provide the required degree of stabilization. The source of the ash shall be identified and approved by the City in advance of stabilization operations. All laboratory test results on the fly ash must be submitted prior to commencement of the work.
2. Water – The water used in the stabilized mixture shall be clean, clear, and free of sewage, vegetable matter, oil, acid and alkali. Water known to be potable may be used without testing. All other sources shall be tested in accordance with AASHTO T-26 or approved by the engineer.

Construction

1. Equipment – The machinery, tools and equipment necessary for the proper execution of the work shall be approved by the engineer prior to beginning any work.
2. Testing – Samples of pulverized material shall be taken from at least three (3) separate areas to be stabilized every one thousand (1,000) feet. The samples should be combined into a single sample for each area and screened through a one (1) inch sieve, and the portion passing the sieve used for testing. Use proctor-size molds for all test samples. Add fly ash to the aggregate in five (5) different proportions, starting at the lower limit ten (10) percent and proceed in convenient increments to the upper limit twenty (20) percent. Mold one test

specimen at each fly ash proportion in accordance with ASTM C-593 compaction procedures at estimated optimum moisture content. Determine the molded dry density of each aggregate-fly ash blend. Plot the test results to identify a peak value or maximum dry density. Select optimum matrix content at least two (2) percent above the matrix content found at maximum dry density. Then determine the optimum moisture content and maximum dry density for that blend. This testing shall be the responsibility of the Contractor and cost shall be incidental to the work of fly ash stabilized recycled base.

3. Fly Ash – The fly ash shall be spread over the entire area to be stabilized to a thickness determined from testing to produce the proper proportions when remixing with twelve (12) inches of pulverized base. The Contractor shall re-pulverize the base incorporating the necessary portions of the existing shoulder to allow for the stabilization. Water shall be added in careful measured rates to obtain the optimum moisture content. Compact to achieve desired density as quickly as possible and finish grade the stabilized material.
4. Proof Roll – After final compaction and prior to paving the Contractor shall conduct a proof roll of the Fly Ash Stabilized Recycled Asphalt Base to determine whether the new base is acceptable for paving. The Contractor shall provide a one (1) day notice to the engineer when requesting and scheduling a proof roll and the proof roll must be witnessed by a representative of the City. The Contractor shall provide a fully loaded water truck, tri-axle or quad-axle truck for proof rolling. The proof roll shall be conducted for the entire length of each area in each traffic lane. If any areas of the roadway deflect more than one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) inch, alternate measures can be proposed, agreed to, and implemented to fix the problem.
5. Time Requirement – Once the stabilizing process has begun, the Contractor shall stabilize, grade, and compact the pulverized material, obtain the required density, pass a proof roll, and place the asphaltic lower layer on the street within five (5) working days.

Measurement and Payment

Unit Prices: Fly ash shall be measured by the ton placed (provided weight tickets) and Fly Ash Stabilization shall be measured by the square yard in place.

- Attach a description of Erosion Control devices and other Best Management Practices to be utilized on the project(s). The description should include, but not be limited to: type of products (i.e. *Geotex Fabric*), manufacturer's names and types of equipment (i.e. self-contained power broom).
- Attach the intended timetable and sequence of construction activities.
- Attach the intended timetable and sequence of Best Management Practices and devices to be implemented for erosion control.
- Attach a site plan showing approximate location(s) of erosion control devices. The site plan shall be at a scale of no less than 1"=100'. The plan shall also indicate the direction of runoff flow, the construction limits, temporary stockpiles and any other significant information.

Upon receipt of all required information, the ECIP will be reviewed within ten (10) working days and all involved parties will be notified as to whether or not the plan meets technical standards.

### EROSION CONTROL-SIMPLIFIED CHECKLIST

#### SITE CHARACTERISTICS

The Contractor may utilize the City of Milwaukee plan set for this contract or provide a site diagram. The following information shall be included:

- The scale of the drawing (not less than 1"=100')
- A north arrow (towards the top or to the right of the plan)
- The name of all project streets and streets abutting the project
- Approximate location of all existing and proposed drainage structures
- The direction of water runoff (flow arrows)
- The limits of construction
- The approximate location of all erosion control devices
- Areas where vegetation will be disturbed and re-established
- For non right-of-way projects, locate watershed areas of overland and concentrated flow. Include area sizes in acres and representative soil type of disturbed areas.

#### Erosion Control Practices

- Stormwater inlet protection:
  1. Any structure that is connected to the drainage system shall be protected from sediment entering the system.
  2. All stormwater inlets adjacent to and on the project site shall have type M inlet protection.
  3. If the frame of any stormwater inlet is removed or openings are in the masonry and stormwater may enter, the protection device should be changed to a type R.
  4. Any manholes that the frame is removed or openings are in the masonry and stormwater may enter shall have a type R erosion control.
- Temporary storage piles:
  1. Storage of erodable materials (i.e. gravel) should not be closer than 25 feet from a roadway or drainage way. If placed in the right-of-way, the stockpiles shall not be placed closer than 100 feet of an unprotected storm drain. Covering or surrounding with straw bales, silt fence or other measures, shall control erosion from stockpiles existing less than ten (10) days. Stockpiles existing longer than ten (10) days shall be seeded and mulched.
- Tracking:
  1. The project and surrounding roadways shall be kept free from materials that may enter the drainage system. Tracked roadways shall be cleaned immediately by means other than flushing with water.
  2. Tracking pads at ingress and egress points may be used to help control tracking of sediment onto roadway surfaces. The pads shall be constructed with a minimum of 2-inch size stone, 8-feet wide and a minimum of 50-feet long.
  3. The project roadways should be cleaned on a daily basis. Cleaning shall be done by means other than flushing with water.

- Location of sediment controls (i.e. silt fence, straw bales, waddles and other planned practices) that minimize the amount of sediment from leaving the site:
  1. The “*Wisconsin Construction Site Best Management Practices Handbook*” should be consulted.
- Dewatering:
  1. Water containing particles of 100 microns or greater shall be treated by use of temporary sediment basins or other devices designed to remove particles of 100 microns or greater.
- Vegetation:
  1. The construction activity should be staged as to limit the amount of time vegetation is stripped and re-established.
- Maintenance:
  1. A schedule for maintaining all erosion control devices is necessary to maximize the effort of limiting sediment from entering the drainage system.
  2. All devices should be checked and maintained after a rainfall event that totals 0.50 inches.
  3. All devices should be checked and maintained at least once a week.

## **NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS**

Effective immediately, the City of Milwaukee has adopted an ordinance relative to Prompt Payment as follows:

2.9.16.b) It is the City's policy to pay all invoices within 30 days. If the City does not make payment within 45 days after receipt of properly completed supporting payment and other required contract documentation, the City shall pay simple interest beginning with the 31st calendar day at the rate of one percent per month (unless the amount due is subject to a good-faith dispute and, before the 45th day of receipt, notice of the dispute is sent to the contractor by first-class mail, personally delivered, or sent in accordance with the notice provisions in the contract). If there are subcontractors, consistent with s.66.0135(3), Wis. Stats., the prime contractor must pay the subcontractors for satisfactory work within seven days of the contractor's receipt of payment from the City of Milwaukee, or seven days from receipt of a properly submitted and approved invoice from the subcontractor, whichever is later. If the contractor fails to make timely payment to a subcontractor, the contractor shall pay interest at the rate of 12 percent per year, compounded monthly, beginning with the 8th calendar day. Reference Common Council File No. 101137 adopted January 2011.

### Department Of Public Works

#### Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Provisions

##### I. General

- A. In accordance with Chapter 370 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation is required in all contracting activities of the Department of Public Works. The ordinance requires that certified SBEs be utilized for 25% of the total dollars annually expended through prime contracts or subcontracts for Construction and the purchase of Goods and Services. For the purchase of Professional Services the requirement is 18%. To that end, the Commissioner of Public Works, as a contracting officer for the City, requires all bidders to utilize SBEs as subcontractors and material suppliers on all contracts. For this contract, bidders are required to achieve the minimum percent of SBE participation listed in the Acknowledgements page/section and/or the Official Notice document.
- B. The prime contractor shall prepare and submit accurate and timely SBE utilization forms and reports to the Department of Public Works. The reports shall include, but not be limited to, Compliance Plan (Form A), monthly utilization (Form D), and SBE subcontractor payment certification (Form E) forms as directed. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until final SBE utilization reports and SBE subcontractor payment certification forms are on file with the Department of Public Works.
- C. During the performance of this contract, the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below:
1. Terminate or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
  2. Consider possible debarment of the prime contractor from bidding.
  3. Withhold payments on the contract.
  4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.

##### II. Definitions

- A. "SMALL BUSINESS ENTERPRISE" (SBE) means a small business concern that is 51% owned, operated and controlled by one or more individuals who are a minority, woman and/or a small business owner (who is at an "economic disadvantage"). The individuals must have day-to-day operational and managerial control and interest in capital, financial risks and earnings commensurate with the percentage of their ownership.
- B. "OWNED, OPERATED AND CONTROLLED" means a business which is one of the following:
1. A sole proprietorship legitimately owned and operated and controlled by a minority, women or an individual at a disadvantage as defined in Chapter 370.
  2. A partnership or joint venture legitimately owned, operated and controlled by individuals who are minorities, women or individuals who are at a disadvantage and who own at least 51% of the beneficial ownership interests in the enterprise and who hold at least 51% of the voting interests of the enterprise eligible as defined in Chapter 370.

3. A corporation legitimately owned, operated and controlled by one or more individuals who are a minority, woman or individual at a disadvantage and who own at least 51% of the outstanding shares and who hold at least 51% of the voting interests of the corporation eligible as defined in Chapter 370.

### III. SBE Utilization Requirements

- A. Each prime contractor shall utilize SBE to the minimum percent listed in the Acknowledgements section/page and or Official Notice Document for this contract. Note that the prime contractors shall be required to attain SBE participation on their base bid excluding specified allowances, alternatives, and change orders. SBE commitments relative to contract award shall be based upon the approved SBE Compliance Plan (Form A).
- B. The determination of SBE utilization shall be based on the following criteria:
  1. The firms identified as SBE by the prime contractor on the SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) must be certified by the Office of Small Business Development prior to bid opening.
  2. The prime contractor shall be credited for the entire expenditure to SBE firms only if all of the identified scope of work is performed directly by the certified SBE firm.
  3. The prime contractor shall be credited for the entire expenditure to SBE manufacturer only if the manufacturer produces goods from raw materials or substantially alters them for resale. Only 20% of the SBE goals may be expended for SBE suppliers that do not manufacture products they supply.
  4. The prime contractor shall count toward the SBE requirement only those payments to SBEs who perform a commercially-useful function in the actual performance of the contract. While that generally means an SBE should be engaged in direct contract work, a "commercially-useful function" may also include management of a third tier subcontractor. For example, while an SBE trucking subcontractor is always expected to perform some direct work on the project, in some cases it may become necessary to subcontract work out to one or more third tier subcontractors. If a third tier subcontractor is also an SBE, the full amount of the work performed by that third tier SBE can be counted toward SBE participation. However, if the third party subcontractor is not an SBE, the prime contractor may only count 20% of the amount being subcontracted to the third tier non-SBE subcontractor. SBEs are required to notify the Department of Public Works if they subcontract out work so that the Department can determine how much, if any, of the subcontracted work can be counted toward the SBE requirement. The Commissioner of Public Works will make the final determination and evaluation of whether the SBE is performing a commercially-useful function.
- C. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that the contractor understands the provisions of Chapter 370 and knows of and intends to comply with them. The completed SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) must be submitted by the apparent low bid contractor within three (3) working days after the identification of the "low bidder."
  1. Information on Form A shall include, but not be limited to:
    - a. The names, addresses, telephone numbers, SBE Certification designation and contact person names for the certified SBE contractors that will participate on the project as subcontractors or suppliers;
    - b. A description of the scope of work to be performed by the SBE on this project; and
    - c. The SBE contractor dollar value(s) and corresponding percentages that the dollar values represent of the total contract amount.

2. Listing an SBE on the Compliance Plan (Form A) shall constitute a representation that the contractor has communicated directly with the SBEs listed. If awarded the contract, the bidder will enter into a subcontract with the firm for the portion of the work listed.
3. SBE participation is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified SBE requirements will render the bid unresponsive. The contract may then be awarded to the next apparent low bidder. Under certain circumstances, failure to meet specified SBE requirements after submission of an apparent low bid may result in surrender of the bidder's bid bond.
4. Only SBEs that have been certified by the Office of Small Business Development may be listed on the SBE Compliance Plan (Form A) and counted towards the percentage requirements on this project. A listing of the currently City certified SBE firms is maintained at:

- D. After execution of the contract, if for any reason an SBE cannot perform, the prime contractor shall contact the Commissioner of Public Works for approval to substitute another certified SBE firm. The prime contractor must submit a written request for substitution which specifies the reasons for the request. Approval must be obtained prior to making substitutions. Any difference in the cost occasioned by such substitution shall be borne by the prime contractor. If the prime contractor cannot find another certified firm to do the work at a comparable price, a non-SBE firm may be substituted with the approval of the Commissioner of Public Works.
- E. If the prime contractor has a problem in meeting the SBE requirements or if any other problems relative to SBE(s) arise during the completion of this project, the prime contractor shall immediately contact the Commissioner of Public Works.
- F. Certification from programs other than the Office of Small Business Development is neither accepted by the City of Milwaukee nor do they have any bearing whatsoever on the eligibility criteria established by the City of Milwaukee.
- G. Right to Appeal.

All contracts awarded under ss.7-14-2 and 7-22 of the City Charter shall be awarded by the Commissioner of Public Works to the lowest responsible bidder determined in accordance with applicable City ordinances for participation of the Office of Small Business Development. Following the opening of any bid involving a determination under applicable City ordinances for participation of SBE, the Commissioner of Public Works shall make a written recommendation as to the lowest responsible bidder and notify all bidders by publication in an official City newspaper as to the content of the written recommendation. Any bidder who objects to the recommendation on grounds of determinations made under applicable City ordinances for participation of SBE may appeal the recommendation on such grounds by filing a written appeal with the Commissioner of Public Works within five (5) working days of the date of publication. The appeal shall state the specific objection to the recommendation, include supporting documentation and specify an alternative recommendation. The Commissioner of Public Works shall schedule a hearing before an appeals committee consisting of the Chair of the Economic Development Committee or the Chair's designee, a member of the Economic Development Committee selected by the Chair and the Director of the Office of Small Business Development to be held within five (5) days of receipt of the appeal. The Committee shall have authority by majority vote to affirm or set aside the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works and its decision in this regard shall be final. In the event a timely appeal, meeting the requirements above is not filed, or the Committee affirms

the Commissioner's recommendation following a timely appeal, meeting the requirements above, the Commissioner shall make an award in accordance with the recommendation.

**Residents Preference Program Provisions**

I. General

- A. In accordance with Chapter 309 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, residents preference hiring is required for all construction contracting activities of the Department of Public Works. The ordinance requires that 40% of WORKER HOURS worked on a DPW contract be performed by UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City, except in special cases where the Commissioner of Public Works determines there is sufficient reason to impose lesser levels of participation. Further, the Commissioner of Public Works may increase the percentage of RESIDENT worker participation to more than 40% on specific contracts. For this contract, bidders are required to show that the minimum percent of WORKER HOURS, as listed in the acknowledgements section/page and/or the Official Notice document will be performed by UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City. Up to one-third of required worker hours may be achieved by documenting the use of UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS on projects undertaken by the contractor where such compliance is not required, or by hiring UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS on a full-time permanent basis for non-construction job categories connected to the project. Such adjustments must be proposed in an affidavit on a form provided by the department setting forth the facts upon which the request for adjustment is based.
- B. The contractor, prior to commencing work, shall submit an affidavit (Form I) for proof of residency for all employees utilized by the contractor and subcontractors to meet the Residents Preference Program requirements, stating that each employee is either UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED and is a RESIDENT of the City. The contractor shall prepare and submit accurate and timely resident utilization forms and reports to the Department of Public Works. Time Reports shall be submitted within ten (10) days following completion of work, or every three months, whichever comes first. The reports shall identify the name, address, race, gender, work classification, wage rates and hours worked of all employees utilized on the contract by the contractor and all subcontractors. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until the summary of hours worked on the back of the Prime Contractor's Affidavit of Compliance is completed and on file with the Department of Public Works. Forms shall be submitted to DPW, Room 506, Municipal Building, 841 North Broadway, Milwaukee, WI 53202.
- C. During the performance of this contract the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, or if the contractor, prime or sub, submits any documents which contain any false, misleading, or fraudulent information, or if the contractor or subcontractor fail to comply with this ordinance, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below.
1. Withhold payments on the contract.
  2. Terminate or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
  3. Consider possible debarment of the contractor from bidding for a period of up to two years.
  4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.
- D. The penalty for any person, firm, or corporation knowingly engaging in fraud, misrepresentation, or in any attempt directly or indirectly, to evade the provisions of this ordinance by providing false, misleading, or fraudulent information shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$1,000 or more than \$5,000 together with the costs of prosecution and, upon default of payment, shall be imprisoned in the county jail or house of correction not to exceed 90 days, or until the forfeiture costs are paid.

II. Definitions

- A. RESIDENT – A person who maintains his or her place of permanent abode in the City of Milwaukee. Domiciliary intent is required to establish that a person is maintaining his or her place of permanent

abode in the City. Mere ownership of real property is not sufficient to establish domiciliary intent. Evidence of domiciliary intent includes, without limitations, the location where a person votes, pays personal income taxes, or obtains a driver's license.

- B. UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED – a RESIDENT that has worked less than 1,200 hours in the preceding 12 months or has not worked in the preceding 30 days or, regardless of employment status, has household income at or below the federal poverty guidelines as adjusted by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction to define eligibility for reduced lunch in public schools. A RESIDENT will continue to qualify as unemployed or underemployed for five (5) years from the date he or she first participates in a contract under Chapter 309. If a RESIDENT becomes an apprentice for a contractor or becomes a participant in an on-the-job training program as determined by the City immediately after or in the course of performing on a particular construction contract, he or she shall continue to qualify as unemployed or underemployed for a period not exceeding 5 years from the date the person became an apprentice or participant in such on-the-job training program.
- C. WORKER HOURS – means the total hours worked on a construction contract by skilled and unskilled construction trade workers, whether those workers are employed by the contractor or any subcontractor. In determining the total worker hours to be furnished at a construction site, the number of hours devoted to all tasks customarily performed on a construction site shall be included, whether or not such tasks are performed on the construction site. "Worker hours" includes work performed by persons filling apprenticeships and participating in on-the-job training programs and excludes the number of hours of work performed by all non-Wisconsin residents.

### III. Residency Utilization Requirements

- A. The contractor shall utilize UNEMPLOYED or UNDEREMPLOYED RESIDENTS of the City in a minimum amount equal to the percentage of the WORKER HOURS as stated in paragraph IA above.
- B. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that it understands the provisions of Chapter 309 and knows of and intends to comply with them, and shall ensure that all subcontractors are also informed.
- C. The contractor shall maintain, and shall ensure that all subcontractors maintain, personnel records listing the name, address, race and gender of all employees utilized for this contract and any records demonstrating that the employees utilized by the contractor in meeting the residency requirements are actual residents of the City. These records shall be maintained for seven (7) years after the contractor has received final payment under the contract and shall be made available to the Commissioner of Public Works upon reasonable notice.
- D. Compliance with these residency requirements is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified residency requirements will render the bid unresponsive, and the Commissioner of Public Works may then recommend the award to the next apparent low bidder.
- E. The City recognizes the following organization which can be contacted for access to trained or qualified workers from the City. Other organizations or sources of qualified RESIDENTS can be used at the bidder's discretion.

**Apprenticeship Provisions**

I. General:

- A. In accordance with Section 309-38 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, apprenticeship requirements will be specified on all Department of Public Works construction contracts, where appropriate, which are in excess of \$100,000. The ordinance requires that a contractor employ apprentices in the performance of the contract and of all subcontracts entered into by the contractor in accordance with the maximum ratio of apprentices to journeymen as established by the Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor, and Human Relations. Fair consideration must be given to minorities and women. For this contract, bidders are required to utilize apprentice(s) from \_\_\_\_\_ of the following trade(s):

(See "Ratio of Apprentices to Journeymen").

- B. The contractor shall prepare and submit an accurate and timely Apprenticeship Utilization Form (Form F) and other reports to the Department of Public Works. The Apprenticeship Utilization Form shall be returned with the executed contract and shall specifically identify the apprentice(s) that will work on the project. The Contractor Time Report shall be submitted within ten (10) days following completion of work or every three (3) months, whichever comes first. Failure to submit the required forms and reports to the Department of Public Works may result in disqualification of future bids, delay of payments, or other appropriate sanctions. Final contract payments will not be made until all apprenticeship related reports are on file with the Department of Public Works.
- C. During the performance of this contract the Department of Public Works reserves the right to conduct compliance reviews. If the contractor is not in compliance with the specifications, the Commissioner of Public Works will notify the contractor in writing of the corrective action that will bring the contractor into compliance. If the contractor fails or refuses to take corrective action as directed, or if the contractor, prime or sub, submits any documents which contain any false, misleading, or fraudulent information, or if the contractor or subcontractor fail to comply with this ordinance, the Department of Public Works may take one or more of the actions listed below:
1. Withhold payments on the contract.
  2. Terminate, suspend, or cancel the contract, in whole or in part.
  3. After due process, consider debarment of the contractor from bidding for a two-year period.
  4. Any other remedy available to the City at law or in equity.

II. Definitions:

- A. Apprentice - a person, 16 years of age or over, who shall enter into a written contract of service where he or she is to receive from or through his or her employer in consideration for his or her services, in whole or in part, instruction in any trade, craft, or business. Apprenticeship agreements shall be governed by Ch. 106, Wis. Stats.

- B. Construction - Means either new construction work or repair work on any roads, bridges, sewers, streets, alleys, buildings, or any other public works.

III. Apprenticeship Utilization Requirements:

- A. The contractor shall utilize apprentices in a minimum amount equal to that stated in paragraph I-A above.
- B. The contractor, by signing and submitting a bid, certifies that the contractor understands the provisions of Chapter 309 and knows of and intends to comply with them.
- C. The contractor shall maintain personnel records listing the names and addresses of its employees utilized for this contract in meeting apprenticeship requirements. These records shall be maintained for three (3) years after the contractor has received final payment under the contract and shall be made available to the Commissioner of Public Works upon reasonable notice.
- D. Compliance with these apprenticeship requirements is an element of bid responsiveness. Failure to meet the specified apprenticeship requirements will render the bid unresponsive, and the Commissioner of Public Works may then recommend award to the next apparent low bidder.
- E. If the prime contractor has problems in meeting the apprenticeship requirements or if any other problems relative to apprenticeship participation arise during the completion of this project, the prime contractor shall immediately contact the Commissioner of Public Works.

(3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the department shall order the contractor to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages within a period specified by the department in the order.

3. In addition to or in lieu of recovering the liability specified in subd. 1. as provided in subd. 2., any employee for and in behalf of that employee and other employees similarly situated may commence an action to recover that liability in any court of competent jurisdiction. If the court finds that a contractor, subcontractor, or contractor's or subcontractor's agent has failed to pay the prevailing wage rate determined by the department under sub. (3) or has paid less than 1.5 times the hourly basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of the prevailing hours of labor, the court shall order the contractor, subcontractor, or agent to pay to any affected employee the amount of his or her unpaid wages or his or her unpaid overtime compensation and an additional amount equal to 100 percent of the amount of those unpaid wages or that unpaid overtime compensation as liquidated damages.

5. No employee may be a party plaintiff to an action under subd. 3. unless the employee consents in writing to become a party and the consent is filed in the court in which the action is brought. Notwithstanding s. 814.04 (1), the court shall, in addition to any judgment awarded to the plaintiff, allow reasonable attorney fees and costs to be paid by the defendant.
